

Notes

"A Light Shines" is a contemporary setting of Psalm 112, which is the proper psalm for the Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time (Cycle A); as well as one of the suggested psalms for the Common of Saints, and for Masses for Those Suffering from Famine or Hunger. In addition to use as a responsorial psalm, this setting could be used as a song during sprinkling, as a communion psalm, or a song for celebrations of ministry, or any feast, memorial or solemnity for celebrations of any of the saints, especially the feast of All Saints.

Psalm 112 is often seen in relationship to the previous psalm, Psalm 111. Psalm 111 is a remembrance of the great works of God, while Psalm 112 is seen to inspire fidelity to the covenant and a call to righteousness, and often regarded as one of the Wisdom psalms. The main theme of this psalm is that the righteous person has a future filled with blessings from God. Our God is lavish with us, unbelievably generous with us.

The paraphrase of the verses published here is an adaptation of the text heard on the recording **Before I Was Born**.

Performance: The overall feel of this musical setting should have a certain lilt and buoyancy, never too heavy or ponderous. If keyboard is used, it should always have a flowing nature - this is where guitars can be very effective. The refrain can be done as written, or as a two- or three-part round. This setting should have a "mantra" type of heartbeat throughout.
